**Course Objectives**

The master's degree in "*Conflict Management and Development*" offers a state-of-the-art learning opportunity for students and practitioners from diverse fields concerned with peace, security and community development. Consisting of six internationally trained tenured faculty and over two dozen researchers, the Chair offers a state-of-the-art teaching and research opportunity to develop pedagogies and understanding of intercultural peace along with knowledge and skills that are increasingly sought in handling today's disputes and conflicts within and across communities as well as at workplace.

This unique master's course takes the students step-by-step through the process of analysing the links between conflict and development in an increasingly globalized world- a world in need of creative and pragmatic pedagogies and understanding to handle a dispute peacefully and transform conflicts towards positive social change. Through this interdisciplinary hands-on course, the students will develop important conflict management knowledge and skills that are increasingly sought in today's job market. A primary goal of this course is to assist students who want to become agents of social change to promote peace and reduce violence. The main objective of the course is to equip the students with fieldwork skills to analyse and handle today's conflicts and to engage with peacebuilding and conflict prevention as critical pedagogy and active vocation.
