# A brief walkthrough of the academic excellence and courtroom advocacy showcased in previous editions.

#### 12th MAHAMANA MALAVIYA NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION

The Faculty of Law, Banaras Hindu University (BHU) successfully hosted the 12th Mahamana Malaviya National Moot Court Competition (MMNMCC) from 28th February to 2nd March, 2025. The competition featured a thoughtfully crafted moot proposition centred on the intricate conflict between ecological conservation, human rights, and constitutional governance.

The proposition invited participants to critically examine complex legal issues, including deficiencies in Environmental **Impact** Assessments (EIA), violations of tribal rights under the Forest Rights Act (FRA) and the Panchayats (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act (PESA), and the controversial invocation of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) against protestors.







The moot problem was drafted by the offices of Shri S. V. Raju, Additional Solicitor General of India, and served as a rigorous test of legal principles, challenging the twenty participating teams from premier law institutions across the country. The Final Round Bench was presided over by three Hon'ble Judges of the High Court of Judicature at Allahabad: Hon'ble Mr. Justice J. J. Munir, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Siddharth, and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Neeraj Tiwari, lending exceptional judicial gravitas to the competition.





#### 11th MAHAMANA MALAVIYA NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION

The 11th edition of the Mahamana Malaviya National Moot Court Competition was organised from March 8-10, 2024. The competition took place in collaboration with the Competition Commission of India and Cyril Amarchand Mangaldas.

This edition saw participation by over 60 teams across the country. The theme for this edition was 'Interplay of Intellectual Property Rights & Competition Law".

The competition was graced by the esteemed presence of Hon'ble (Dr.) Justice B.S. Chauhan, Judge (Retd.), Supreme Court of India, Dr. Saurabh and Dr. Ashutosh Kumar, Joint Directors (Eco.), Competition Commission of India, Dr. Pawan Kumar Panday, Deputy Registrar of Trademarks and Gl, Mr. Vijay Pratap Singh Chauhan, Partner, Cyril Amarchand Mangaldas.









Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow, emerged as the winner of the competition and runner-up award was bagged by Hidayatullah National Law University, Raipur.

### **RULEBOOK**

#### **Short Title**

These Rules shall be called the 13th MMNMCC Rules, 2026.

#### **Definitions**

In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires:

- a) "Organizers" refers to the Moot Court Committee, Faculty of Law, BHU.
- b) "Competition" refers to the 13th Mahamana Malaviya National Moot Court Competition, 2026, organized by the Faculty of Law, BHU.
- c) "Advanced Rounds" refers to the Quarter-final, Semi-final, and Final rounds.
- d) "Law School" refers to the Faculty of Law, BHU.
- e) "Teams" refers to the teams that have registered, either provisionally or finally, in adherence to the procedure prescribed hereinafter.
- f) "Official Mail" refers to the e-mail ID of the Moot Court Committee, Faculty of Law, BHU viz., 'mcc@bhu.ac.in'.
- g) "Organizing Committee" refers to the student body organizing the 13th MMNMCC under the supervision of the Organizing Secretary.





#### **GENERAL:**

Administration:

The '13th Mahamana Malaviya National Moot Court Competition, 2026' is to be organized by the Faculty of Law, Banaras Hindu University.

#### Date:

The Competition shall be held from the 13th March 2026 to the 15<sup>th</sup> March 2026, in physical mode, at the Faculty of Law, Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh - 221005.

Language: The official language for the Competition shall be English.

#### Structure of the Competition:

The Competition shall consist of the following:

- Memorial Selection Round,
- Researcher's Test,
- Two Preliminary Rounds and,
- Three Advanced Rounds, viz. Quarter-finals, Semi-Finals, and Final.

#### **Dress Code:**

All the participants shall adhere to the following dress code for the Competition:

- Ladies: Black and White Western or Indian Formals
- Gentlemen: Black and White Western Formals





#### **PARTICIPATION AND ELIGIBILITY:**

Students pursuing either a 3-year or a 5-year LL.B. degree from any Law School/College/University recognized by the Bar Council of India are eligible to participate. Each participating institution shall send only one team to the Competition.

- Team members must be bona fide students of the institution they are representing.
- Teams participating in the Competition must be duly authorized by the Moot Court Society/ Faculty-in-charge/ Dean of their respective Institute to participate.
- Once registered, a Team will not be permitted to vary its composition in any manner.

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

#### **Team Composition:**

The participating team shall comprise a minimum of two (2) and a maximum of three (3) members. In a team of two (2) members, both the members shall be designated as 'Speakers' and one of the two Speakers shall be considered as 'Researcher' (which is to be notified at the time of Final Registration). In a team of three (3) members, two members shall be designated as 'Speakers' and the third member of the team shall be designated as a 'Researcher'.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to bar any team from participating in the Competition.





#### **REGISTRATION:**

- Teams willing to participate in the '13th Mahamana Malaviya National Moot Court Competition, 2026' are required to register by duly submitting a filled <u>Google form</u> and making a payment of the amount of ₹ 2,000 on or before 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2026, 11:59 PM IST. The details of the payment method will be intimated after the successful submission of the Google form.
- Students can also scan the QR available in the poster for provisional registration.
- This shall be considered as provisional registration of the participating institution. Accordingly, each participating team shall be provided with a team code.
- All the provisionally registered teams will have to submit the soft copy of their memorials (on behalf of both the Petitioner and Respondent) by 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2026, 11:59 PM IST via Google Form.
- The top 24 teams based on their memorial scores will be permitted to proceed with the final registration. The results of the memorial round shall be announced on 19<sup>th</sup> February, 2026.
- Teams qualifying the memorial rounds shall have to deposit a participating fee of ₹ 4,000 (inclusive of accommodation) by 28th February 2026, 11:59 PM IST.
- In case, any of the shortlisted 24 teams fail to make the payment by the above-mentioned date, it will automatically forfeit its claim to participate in the competition. In case of forfeiture by one or more teams, the subsequent waitlisted team(s) will be informed and allowed to complete their registration after the submission of the fee within a stipulated time allocated to the them in this regard.





- The registration will be deemed complete only once the soft copy of the payment receipt, along with the registration form, is duly mailed to <a href="mailto:mcc@bhu.ac.in">mcc@bhu.ac.in</a>, and the confirmation of the same will be sent to the teams.
- In case of any dispute, discrepancy, differences, etc., the final discretion shall vest with the Organising Committee of the 13th Mahamana Malaviya National Moot Court Competition, 2026, and its decisions shall be final and binding. Furthermore, the Organising Committee also reserves the right to cancel the registration of any team at any stage in case of misconduct, incapacity, or for any other improper act or likewise.

#### **Memorial Submission**

- Each team participating in the Competition must prepare one Memorial on behalf of the Petitioner(s)/Appellant(s)/Applicant(s) and one on behalf of the Respondent(s)/Defendant(s).
- Each team must submit the soft copies of each side of the Memorials [One (1) in MS Word .doc/.docx format and One (1) in .pdf format] for evaluation by 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2026, 11:59 PM IST at Google form. The file names of the electronic copies of the Memorials must contain only the Team Code and the side which is represented in the following format: e.g., (for Team Code: 10) 10-P or 10-R, 'P' being for "Petitioner" Memorial and 'R' for "Respondent" Memorial and so forth.
- Soft copies of Memorials submitted beyond the deadline of 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2026, 11:59 PM IST shall incur a penalty of 05 Marks for each day of delay till 13<sup>th</sup> February, 2026, 11:59 PM IST.





- Any soft copy of the Memorials received after 13<sup>th</sup> February, 2026, will be subjected to immediate disqualification thereafter.
- Further, each shortlisted team for the preliminary rounds shall submit Six (6) Hard Copies of each side of the Memorial by 13<sup>th</sup> March, 2026.
- Each memorial shall necessarily consist of only the following sections:
  - a) Cover Page
  - b) Table of Contents
  - c) List of Abbreviations
  - d) Index of Authorities
  - e) Statement of Jurisdiction
  - f) Statement of Facts (not exceeding two pages)
  - g) Statement of Issues
  - h) Summary of Arguments (not exceeding two pages)
  - i) Written Arguments (not exceeding 20 pages)
  - j) Prayer (not exceeding 1 page)
- Each memorial shall only have the following on its Cover Page:
  - a) The team code on the top right-hand corner of the Cover page
  - b) The name and place of the forum
  - c) The relevant legal provision under which the Court is approached
  - d) Name of parties and their status
  - e) Memorandum filed on behalf of Party(s)
- The Memorials shall be 'Spiral Bound'. The Memorials must bear a Cover Page in conformity with the following scheme:
  - a) Petitioner(s)/Appellant(s): Blue
  - b) Respondent(s): Red





#### **Memorial Format**

- All the pages of the Memorial must be of A4 Size with an equal margin of 1 inch on each side. The text font for the 'Main Body' must be Times New Roman, Size 12, with 1.5 Line Spacing. The alignment should be justified.
- The text font for the 'Footnotes' must be Times New Roman, Size 10, with 1.0 Line Spacing. Character Spacing should not be condensed in any manner.
- Footnotes must not be explanatory.
- An illustrative example of an acceptable footnote: A v. B, AIR 1973 SC 22, 23- 24 [hereinafter X].
- An illustrative example of an unacceptable footnote: A v. B, AIR 1973 SC 22, 2324 [hereinafter X] (holding that the Right to Information Act was in fact against the express provisions of Art. 14 of the Constitution of India).
- Teams shall cite authorities in the Memorial using footnotes following the Harvard Bluebook 20th Edition and the footnoting must be uniform throughout the Memorial.

#### **Exchange of Memorials**

- The exchange of Memorials will take place on the day of physical registration i.e., 13<sup>th</sup> March, 2026. Teams are strictly forbidden from making any annotations on the exchanged Memorials.
- Teams are also prohibited from reproducing photocopies of such Memorials.
- The Memorial of the opposing team must be returned to the Court Officers upon the completion of each Round.





#### **Evaluation**

The maximum score for each Memorial shall be 100 Marks. The memorials shall be evaluated on the following criteria:

#### **Penalties**

Non-observance or violation of the rules, as mentioned earlier, by any team in respect of the Memorials will lead to the following penalties:

#### **Structure of the Competition**

#### A. Researcher's Test:

- The Researcher's Test shall be conducted on 13th March, 2026.
- The format of the test shall be based on MCQs.
- Every Team member designated as a Researcher has to be present at the time of the Researcher's Test.
- Questions for the Researcher's Test will be formulated based on the factual circumstances of the Moot Proposition, as well as relevant legal principles and statutes.
- The Researcher's Test is exclusively open to the designated researchers of the Participating Teams.
- In case there are only two members in a team, either one of them may partake in the Researcher's test.
- The duration of the test will be 60 minutes.
- In the event of a tie, the score of the memorials will be used to ascertain the "Best Researcher".

#### **B. Oral Round Procedures:**

**General Procedures:** 

The oral rounds shall be conducted in offline mode at the venue and shall comprise four rounds in total:

- Preliminary Round (Prelims I and II)
- Quarter-Final Round
- Semi-Final Round
- Final Round





#### **Procedure for Oral Submission:**

- Before the beginning of the Oral Rounds, each Team shall inform the Court Officer:
  - The time for which each speaker, namely Speaker-1 and Speaker-2, shall argue before the Bench,
  - The minutes reserved for rebuttal (in case of Petitioner) or surrebuttal (in case of Respondent), shall be subject to the discretion of the judges.
- Each team will get a total of 25 minutes (in Preliminary and Quarter-Final Rounds) and 35 minutes (in Semi-Finals and Final Round) to present their case. This time will include the time reserved for rebuttal or sur-rebuttal, subject to the discretion of the Judges.
- The division of time between the two speakers is up to the discretion of the team. In case of the Preliminary & Quarter-final rounds, each team shall be allotted 25 minutes to present their case, subject to a minimum of 10 minutes and a maximum of 15 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal, and sur-rebuttal. For the semi-finals and final round, each team shall be allotted 35 minutes to present their case, subject to a minimum of 15 minutes and a maximum of 20 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal and sur-rebuttal.
- The oral arguments should be strictly confined to the issues presented in the memorial.
- The researcher must be present with the speakers during the oral rounds. Maximum scores for the oral rounds shall be 100 points per speaker per judge.





The oral rounds shall be judged on the following criteria:

### Preliminary Rounds (Prelims 1 and 2)

- There shall be two (2) Preliminary Rounds. All the selected Teams which have qualified the memorial rounds will be participating in the Preliminary Rounds.
- Each team shall have the opportunity to argue on both sides, as a Petitioner and a Respondent, in each round.





- Each team shall be allotted 25 minutes to present their case, subject to a limit of a minimum of 10 minutes and a maximum of 15 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal, and sur-rebuttal.
- No two teams shall face each other more than once in the Preliminary Rounds.
- No Team shall face the same Bench more than once in the Preliminary Rounds.
- Teams with two straight wins in the Preliminary Rounds would advance to the next round. Teams with less than two wins may also advance to the next round on the basis of cumulative team scores in both the Preliminary Rounds.
- The memorial scores shall be used as a tie-breaker in case of a tie.

#### **Quarter-Final Rounds**

- A total of eight (8) Teams shall proceed to the Quarter-Final Rounds from the Preliminary Rounds, which shall comprise of four (4) fixtures.
- In the Quarter-Final Rounds, each Team shall argue from the side allotted to them on the basis of the draw of lots.
- Each team shall be allotted 25 minutes to present their case. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal, and sur-rebuttal, subject to a limit of a minimum of 10 minutes and a maximum of 15 minutes per speaker.
- The Quarter-Final Rounds shall be similar to knock-outs, i.e., the team with the lesser score shall be eliminated.
- The Winning Teams in each of the four Quarter-Final Rounds shall advance to the Semi-Final Rounds.





#### Semi-Final Rounds

- The Semi-Final Rounds shall consist of the top four teams, who have secured the higher score in their respective Quarter-Final Round against their opponents.
- In the Semi-Final Rounds, each Team shall argue from the side allotted to them based on the draw of lots.
- Each team shall be allotted 35 minutes to present their case, subject to a minimum of 15 minutes and a maximum of 20 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal and sur-rebuttal.
- The Winning Team from each of the two Semi-Final Rounds shall advance to the Final Round.

#### **Final Round**

- For the Final Round, the Teams shall argue on the side allotted to them on the basis of the draw of lots.
- Each team shall be allotted 35 minutes to present their case, subject to a minimum of 15 minutes and a maximum of 20 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal and sur-rebuttal.
- The Winner of the Final Round (i.e., the team obtaining a Higher Score) shall be adjudged as the 'Winner of the Competition'.

**NOTE:** Use of any Electronic Gadgets is strictly prohibited during Researcher's Test and Oral Rounds. Non-compliance with the Rules shall lead to immediate disqualification.





#### Compendium

Submission of a compendium is not mandatory. If a team decides to submit a compendium, a hard copy must be submitted as per the following guidelines:

- The Compendium can be presented at the discretion of the Judge.
   If permitted, it must happen 10 minutes before the commencement of the rounds.
- The compendium for the book/case or any other resource shall be cited on the first page of the resource and the relevant pages only.
   For instance, for citing a paragraph(s) from a case X v. Y, the first page of the case, followed by relevant pages, shall be cited for this part of the compendium.
- The responsibility of creating a comprehensive, accessible compendium folder lies with the teams. Teams must also provide an index for their compilation.
- In the interest of ensuring anonymity, the material passed as a compendium to the Bench must not contain any sign, symbol, or text that reveals the identity of the institution to which the team belongs.

#### **Scouting**

Teams shall not be allowed to observe the Oral Rounds of another team unless they have been officially knocked out of the Competition. Scouting is strictly prohibited. Scouting by any team shall entail immediate disqualification.





#### **Adherence to Anonymity**

- During the Oral Rounds, participating teams shall not state their names or the name of the Institution to which they belong or any personal details and instead must use the Team Code allotted to them.
- The team shall not disclose their identity anywhere in their written Memorials and instead should use the Code allotted. Failure to comply with any of the conditions stipulated above shall result in immediate disqualification of the team. The decision of the Organizing Committee in this regard would be final.

#### **Accommodation and Food**

- Accommodation shall be provided to all the teams by the Organizers from the morning of 13th March, 2026, to the evening of 15th March, 2026.
- Food shall be provided to all the teams for the aforementioned duration.
- Accommodation and food shall be provided solely to participants, limited to a maximum of three members.

#### **Clarifications Regarding the Competition**

- Participants can seek clarifications regarding the Moot Proposition by sending in their queries to <a href="mailto:mcc@bhu.ac.in">mcc@bhu.ac.in</a> on or before 28th January, 2026, 11:59 PM IST.
- A list of clarifications shall be released and sent to all participants on 30th January, 2026.





#### **Miscellaneous Rules of the Competition**

- Participating Teams are expected to conduct themselves in a manner befitting the legal profession and maintain the appropriate decorum of the courtroom during the proceedings.
- The Organizing Committee retains the right, at its sole discretion, to take appropriate action for any unethical, unprofessional, and wrongful conduct throughout the Moot Court Competition.
- The Organizing Committee's decision concerning the interpretation of these rules or any other matters relating to the Moot Court Competition shall be final and binding. If there is any situation not covered by these rules, the decision of the Organizing Committee shall be conclusive.
- The Organizing Committee reserves the right to amend, modify, or repeal any of the rules if required and as deemed appropriate.
   Participating Teams shall receive adequate notice of any/all such amendments or modifications to the rules and regulations.





#### **AWARDS**

The winners shall be awarded Cash prizes, Certificates, Trophies, access to SCC Online Web Edition and other perks which may be announced at the later stage of the Competition.
